REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

District Update:

Mr. Zinni shared information on the following topics:

- Disproportionation report from DESE indicated not identified, not flagged, which explained is a good rating.
- Healthy KP hosted The Fifth Quarter that was held following the football game on Friday night that KP won. Healthy KP is a volunteer group who are concerned about our youth and keeping them substance free. Executive Director Bigness, Mr. Lewis, and members of Healthy KP organized the event with the assistance of countless volunteers, including members of the KP Administrative Team.
- Graduation will be moved from Saturday, June 4 to Sunday, June 5 at Stonehill College. Mr. Knott asked that the
 district explore the possibility of having graduation back at KP rather than at an off-campus location.

- Mask Status:

Mr. Zinni provided an update on the vaccination calculation rate that includes a combination of fully vaccinated staff and students in each building. Once the 80% calculation has been met, Mr. Zinni will be working on obtaining a waiver form to send to the state.

- College Initiatives and dual entollment:

Mr. Zinni, Dr. Gilson, and Dr. Mobley met this morning with UMass-Dartmouth delegates to discuss a college initiative program for MS and HS students. UMass-Dartmouth is very eager to look at some options that include college enrichment programs, (offered at a low-cost option), work opportunities and internships that will also be explored.

Dual enrollment was also discussed with KP faculty being hired at the college level as an adjunct professor to teach a college syllabus to students and to be able to award them a college grade. Mr. Zinni noted that within the next week, meetings will also be held with William James College and Middlesex College to discuss the college initiative program.

NEW BUSINESS:

HS School Improvement Plan: Dr. Mobley

Dr. Mobley presented the 2021-2024 HS School Improvement Plan (FIS SIP) aligned to the District Strategic Plan and Goals. The HS designed their School Improvement Plan with School Council and with Faculty contributions to develop 3 Strategic Goals that includes Action Plans for each Goal. Discussion ensued on terminology and examples used in the HS SIP.

Following discussion on Action Plan – Goal #2.4a, Dr. Mobley will amend the HS SIP and delete the word "persons" and include projected dates of completion and/or an assessment of progress or completion for the 2nd reading to be presented at the next School Committee meeting. Dr. Mobley will also provide an update/review of the HS SIP to the School Committee in February 2022.

UNFNISHED BUSINESS:

Capital Improvement:

Mr. Zinni gave an update on the capital improvement audit that was done on immediate and long-term needs of the school buildings. On a more current note, the Guidance Offices have been moved into the library due to findings based upon air quality testing and filtration systems in the Guidance Suite caused by summer dampness. Mr. Zinni indicated that there is no evidence of actual mold. Guidance will remain in the library until the problem has been solved as we do not want our staff and students in that environment until it has been resolved. We are waiting for the final reports to be provided. As a next step, the library will be remodeled by creating new spaces for privacy to meet everyone's needs.
