- *Collage means: full, colorful, creative, “mixing pot”*

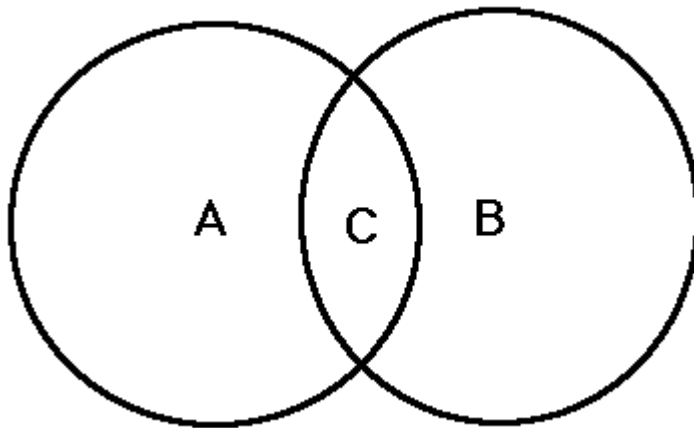

- Left circle (A): agree with 10 phrases (*5 primary, 5 wing*)  
LABEL
- Center (C): disagree with 6 phrases (*3 primary, 3 wing*)  
LABEL
- Right circle (B): overall conclusion should explain:
  1. Primary # with title, wing # with title
  2. Which result you most relate to or maybe you relate with a # not given as a result
  3. An overall opinion of taking the test and the results in at least 3 sentences
