AGENDA ITEMS:

School Safety Committee:

Mr. Chaplin and Mrs. Fischer, members of the Safety & Security Committee, explained that they have spent 18 months of work and preparation in the event of an emergency violent situation. Mrs. Fischer displayed the "Go-Bucket" that is an actual 5-gallon bucket that includes some of the essential recommended items that should be on

hand in every classroom and office in the school setting in the event of an emergency as teachers and students may need to be in a classroom for several hours.

Mrs. Fischer referred to the States recommendations as outlined in the "School Safety & Security" presented to Gov. Deval L. Patrick from the MA Task Force Report. Referred to page 29 "Go-Kit". The goal is to get the bucket into every classroom and offices by the end of the year, including a first-aid medical kit. The Go-Bucket would also include a list of class rosters, map of the building, rally points and emergency protocol to be on hand should they need to be locked down. Meeting this goal will meet one of the governor's goals.

The School Safety Committee has been working very closely with local law enforcement officers including Officers Eckyl and Palladini. The philosophy is: "Be prepared, not scared." Teaching the staff what to do and use what is in their classroom to protect everyone and the knowledge of barricade training has been a very important aspect of the ALICE Training (a two-day training course).

Discussion ensued on the cost of providing a stocked Go-Bucket for every classroom within the district as each bucket would cost approximately \$30-\$40 per bucket.

School Committee members had a few observations on funding including having an "Adopt a bucket" fundraiser, or have parents sponsor a bucket. Another suggestion was to ask the police departments if there is any grant money available.

This item will be placed on the next Budget & Finance Subcommittee to explore options.

MS and HS School Improvement Plans:

Dr. Gilson and Dr. Oliveira presented the MS and the HS 2014/2015 School Improvement Plans. These documents show the progress on both schools along with the assessment of progress. The Assessment of Progress column has been updated to reflect things accomplished, in process or planned at this point in the year. The School Improvement Plans are aligned with the strategic initiatives and the superintendent's goals for the district.

Discussion ensued on the teacher evaluation process. Dr. Gilson instituted a teacher team training session during the summer who stepped in and trained in both schools guiding them through it. Now we have TeachPoint which is a web-based program, and goals have been received from all of the faculty. There is an on-going review of self-assessment materials, a review of goals and we in the process of refining goals. Evidence has been gathered to support the goals. Along with every indicator required, there is evidence of specific indicators that have been set which includes 3 pieces or less per indicator and a particular piece could cover more than one indicator.

He urged school committee members to send emails to representatives, as cuts to regional transportation forces the regional schools to cut generally on the educational side of the budget to fund transportation. Need strong effort to get some of the transportation aid reinstated.
