FY23 SCHOOL CHOICE PUBLIC HEARING-7PM:

Mr. Knott opened the FY23 School Choice Public Hearing at 7:04pm.

Mr. Knott asked for comments from the public hearing. There were none.

Mr Zinni recommended that the District move not to participate in School Choice for FY23 due to the current enrollment within the District. A Motion was made by Mr. Lehan, seconded by Mr. Cates.

Discussion ensued on how the determination is made to set a cap for class size and financial implications.

REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

District Update:

Mr. Zinni gave an update on the following topics:

Teacher Appreciation Day, Principals' Day, Administrative Assistants' Day, Nurses' Day, School Lunch Heroes' Day and other appreciation days (too numerous to mention them all).-Mr. Zinni extended appreciation to all staff throughout the school district for all they do each day to make a difference in the lives of our students and community.

U.S. News & World Report-Education 4/25/22-KP High School National Ranking:

King Philip was rated in the top 12% in the Country and the top 24% in the State according to the U.S. News & World Report-Education dated 4/25/22. Mr. Zinni explained that the scores were exactly the same as last year's report.

Massachusetts outperformed the country and KP consistently outperforms the state. Mr. Zinni has provided a link to all committee members to see the actual calculations.

District Update:

AP/MCAS Exams:

Mr. Zinni reminded committee members that this week and next AP exams will be held as well as MCAS.. Mr. Zinni mentioned that the administration team has jumped in to help with proctoring of exams due to the shortage of staff that have since retired. Kudos were given to the technology department for keeping on top of things and helping to rectify any technology issues.

Legally Blond: Performances will be held this upcoming weekend at KP High School.

Music Groups: chorus/band groups for the middle and high schools will be performing.

Healthy KP Workshop:

Mr. Zinni mentioned there is a workshop on mental health being put on this evening by Dot Pearl and the Healthy KP Staff.

MASC Conference:

Mr. Zinni reminded all school committee members that the MASC conference will be held on 11/2/22-11/5/22 in Hyannis and that this conference is a joint conference for both superintendents and school committee members. Mr. Knott welcomed any school committee member to attend this conference.

Mr. Zinni shared with the committee that the 2022/2023 school year calendar needed to be amended due to the oversight of the January 1st holiday being observed on Monday January 2, 2023 as the legal holiday.

Fee Structure/ExtraCurricular Activities:

Based on a previous request by Mr. Cates, Mr. Zinni explained the process normally followed when a student is unable to pay a user fee to participate in school activities including sports. Mr. Zinni explained that free and reduced lunch participation is normally used to determine the level of the student's need, but since as an outcome of the pandemic, the school district is offering universal free lunch to all students, this information has not been available. Mr. Zinni further explained that universal free lunch would be ending in June and that free and reduced lunch applications will once again be completed by families for the upcoming school year and would be used to assist in this process.

Mr. Cates would like to see our form revised. No further discussion needed.

FY2023 BICO Appointment to the Board of Directors:
