STUDENT COUNCIL REPORT:

The March 20, 2023 HS Student Council Report was read into the minutes by Ms. Addison Lewis.

REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

District Update:

Mr. Zinni congratulated Ms. Addison Lewis as one of the DECA winners going to Florida for the National Competition.

Mr. Zinni said the Friday Night Live event was a huge success and everyone did a great job.

Mr. Zinni shared that Dr. Mobley will be leaving the district at the end of this school year to become the Executive Director at the Advanced Math and Science Public Charter School District. Mr. Zinni publicly thanked Dr. Mobley for doing a stellar job of leading the high school and wished her well as she moves forward with her career. She will be missed.

Mr. Zinni and Dr. Drolet have had conversations regarding the principal search. The new principal will need to be appointed while Mr. Zinni is still Superintendent so this person can start on July 1. Dr. Drolet will be the key person hiring this person.

Mr. Zinni received an email from Ms. Nerlino. Ms. Nerlino worked on a project with a couple of students and wanted to give major props to five KP high school students: Ahunna James, Christopher Sesay, Bastion Hamilton, Lauren Barriero and Victoria Cosmo who presented the Bystander Intervention Training at the 2023 Connections Conference. Their presentations were so amazing that administrators, teachers and several people from MIAA came up to Ms. Nerlino afterwards and marveled at what a wonderful job they did and asked if they would be willing to do other versions of the training. Mr. Zinni will respond to Ms. Nerlino's email congratulating her and those students.

Mr. Zinni said the budget presentation was presented on March 9th to the Plainville Finance Committee. Mr. Azer and Mr. Zinni will be presenting the budget to the Norfolk Finance Committee on April 5th.

Mr. Zinni said the spring middle school band concert was held last week and was a wonderful show. The middle school chorus will be held this week.

A follow up communication was sent to Senator Rausch and Representative Vaughn on behalf of Superintendents Allardi, Cameron, Parson and Zinni, asking them for their support again on some of the legislation issues which they would like to have addressed. A copy of the letters are attached to these minutes.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Middle School program of studies:

Mr. Knott asked members if they had any questions on the recommended changes on the middle school program of studies. Mr. Lehan commented that this package was very well presented.

Adoption of FY 2024 Budget:

Mr. Zinni said the budget presentation was done during the public hearing on March 6, 2023. The only update was just before the last meeting we received enough information to put the assessments together. Mr. Azer explained the FY 2024 Chapter 70 Aid which is included in the attached budget presentation.

Mr. Zinni explained that it was important to note that when the new formula came out, the student opportunity act and the formula came along with it. Mr. Zinni thanked Dr. Gilson for putting together the significant reporting and explaining how we are using the money that we normally would be using anyway.

• A Motion was made by Mr. Cates, seconded by Mr. Lehan, to adopt the FY 2024 total budget (including debt service) of \$40,008,775 with the member town assessments of:

Mr. Zinni explained that we try to get the school calendar out this time each year so that families may plan for next year. Dr. Gilson pointed out that the MCAS testing schedule is not published yet and that she would recommend approval of the school calendar with the option that it could be amended at a later date.
