Todd Lindmark Scholarship criteria:

- 1. Applicant must be a graduating KPHS Senior and have played a minimum of 3 seasons of youth soccer in Norfolk, Plainville or Wrentham. "Youth Soccer" is defined as pre-k through 6th grade. If possible, applicant should acknowledge a coach they played for. Please include the grades/years you played and for which organization(s).
- 2. Applicant must have been active in community service or an organizational activity. No specific criterion is established but greater consideration is given for greater depth of involvement. Highest consideration is given for someone who acted in a leadership capacity or led the initiation of a significant new activity. Applicants will need to specify on their application (one additional sheet of paper may be used).
- 3. In the absence of community service, an applicant can receive equal consideration if one of the following applies:
 - a. The applicant had minimum involvement in community service because they were highly active in a school activity other than sports such as DECA, Student Council, Arts, etc. In such an instance the applicant should state how they contributed to the betterment of that activity.
 - b. The applicant had a minimum involvement in community service because it was necessary for them to maintain after school employment. In such an instance the applicant should state how this employment contributes to their preparation for college/trade school from a financial or maturity standpoint (response may be shared on one separate sheet of paper and will be held completely confidential).
- 4. The strongest applicants will have met more than the minimum number of seasons required to apply while also having the strongest record of community service (with community service being held as the #1 factor).

Applicants should complete attached application and essay and submit to it the King Philip High School Guidance Office by April 15th.
