Proposed changes to the KPRSD Student Handbook, 2023-2024

Below are proposed changes to the King Philip Regional School District Student Handbook for 2023-2024.

Proposed Change #1: page 105 - Middle School: Electronics Policy

Current Language:

Students must secure all personal electronic devices including, but not limited to, cellular phones, smartphones, personal/portable electronic devices, tablets, and laptops and/or headphones in their lockers. To enhance and support learning, the district will provide requisite technology to students during the school day as needed.

Proposed Language:

Students must secure in a school approved location, all personal electronic devices including, but not limited to, cellular phones, smartphones, personal/portable electronic devices, tablets, laptops and/or smartwatches. Headphones shall also be secured in a school approved location unless directed by faculty to use headphones for instructional purposes. To enhance and support learning, the district will provide requisite technology to students during the school day as needed.

RATIONALE: We would like to clarify language and add information about smartwatches and headphones.



Proposed Change #2: page 80 - Disciplinary Infraction Guideline: Cell Phone (Middle School Only)

Current Language:

Cellphone and other personal electronic devices including headphones use and/or Possession (Middle School Only)

1st Offense – Warning and confiscation w/student pick up

2nd Offense – Office Detention and confiscation w/ guardian pick up

3rd Offense – Saturday Detention and confiscation w/ guardian pick up

Proposed Language:

Cellphone and other personal electronic devices including headphones use and/or Possession (Middle School Only)

Office detention, confiscation and guardian pick up; and/or Saturday Detention

RATIONALE: We wanted to simplify the language in this section.

Proposed Change #3: pages 79-81 - Disciplinary Infraction Guideline

Current Language:

3 rd Offense – Saturday Detention 4 th Offense - possible suspension

There are no middle school specific consequences for "Tardy to Class" and "Cheating/Plagiarism."

Proposed Language:

Class Truancy (Middle School Only)	Subject to Office Detention, Saturday Detention, In-school Suspension, Out of School Suspension
Tardy to Class (Middle School Only)	Subject to Lunch Detention, Teacher Detention, Office Detention, Saturday Detention and/or Restorative Practices
Cheating/Plagiarism (Middle School Only)	Subject to Lunch Detention, Teacher Detention, Office Detention, Saturday Detention and/or Restorative Practices

RATIONALE: We would like to update/add middle school appropriate consequences to the chart.



Proposed Change #4: pages 89-90 - Middle School: Honor Roll

Current Language:

In order for a student to receive recognition as an honor student, certain high standards of achievement must be set each marking period.

- A student will be placed on the "Highest Honor Roll" for outstanding achievement
 if he/she receives all A's in the major subject areas, which include language arts,
 science, mathematics, and social studies (and world language for grade eight
 students only).
- A student will be placed on the "High Honor Roll" if he/she receives all A's and B's
 in the major subject areas, which include language arts, science, mathematics, and
 social studies (and world language for grade eight students only).
- A student will receive recognition on the "Honor Roll" by earning all B's in the major subject areas, which include language arts, science, mathematics, and social studies (and world language for grade eight students only).
- In addition, all students must receive a minimum of a B- in all other courses.

Proposed Language:

To be considered for the honor roll, students must be taking a full schedule of courses. Students who are taking a reduced course load pursuant to an agreed upon Section 504 plan or Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) are eligible for honor roll. For a student to receive recognition on the honor roll, certain high standards of achievement must be met each marking period. Students with "Incomplete" grades are ineligible for the honor roll at the time of publication.

- High Honors A's in all courses
- Honors A's and/or B's in all courses

RATIONALE: The change allows for the middle school language to match the language for the high school honor roll criteria (p. 112).
