First KPRHS 2023-2024 Peer Mentor Social

After school on September 27th I attended the first Peer Mentor Social of this school year (see photo below). Thanks go out to advisors Pat Dennis and Lisa Halloway, as well as our many other staff and student volunteers, for leading and participating in this program. The goal of the peer mentoring program is to strengthen student ties to the community. Peer mentors serve as role models to some of our students with IEPs by providing support and friendship during the school day as well as during monthly meetings, field trips, and school activities. There are over 100 KP students in our peer mentoring program, including some students from our 18-22 year-old Links program, as well as some of our out-of-district students.

New England Association of School Superintendents Conference

October 4th through October 6th I attended the New England Association of School Superintendents (NEASS) Annual Conference, which was held this year in Newport, RI. This 205th annual conference is interestingly the oldest annual superintendents' conference in the country, which was first held in the 1800's when superintendents traveled to get there by horse and buggy. The theme for this year's conference was: Courage to Lead: "We cannot control the wind, but we can direct the sail." There were a record number of attendees at the conference this year and besides attending some good sessions, I was also able to present on a panel, facilitated by retired KP Superintendent Zinni, about effective communication for school leaders (see photo below).
