

- Do not worry about whether you have the knowledge or skills, or how much money you would earn, etc.



• **Job Zones**: Click, "next" to move on to Job zones. Job zones help you to identify how much training/schooling you would like to complete toward a career.



Job Zone 1, Little or no job prep, means:

<u>Training:</u> Employees in these occupations need anywhere from a few days to a few months of training. Usually, an experienced worker could show you how to do the job.

<u>Education</u>: Some of these occupations may require a high school diploma or GED certificate.

Job Zone 2, Some job prep, means:

<u>Training:</u> Employees in these occupations need anywhere from a few months to one year of working with experienced employees. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.

<u>Education</u>: These occupations usually require a high school diploma.

Zone 3, Medium job prep, means:

<u>Training:</u> Employees in these occupations usually need one or two years of training involving both on-the-job experience and informal training with experienced workers. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.

Education: Most occupations in this zone require training in vocational schools, related on-the-job experience, or an associate's degree.

Zone 4, High job prep, means:

<u>Training:</u> Employees in these occupations usually need several years of work-related experience, on-the-job training, and/or vocational training.

<u>Education:</u> Most of these occupations require a four-year bachelor's degree, but some do not.

Zone 5, Extensive job prep, means:

<u>Training:</u> Employees may need some on-the-job training, but most of these occupations					
assume that the person will already have the required skills, knowledge, work-related					
experience, and/or training.					
Education: Most of these occupations require graduate school. For example, they may require a master's degree, and some require a Ph.D., M.D., or J.D. (law degree).
