STUDENT COUNCIL REPORT

Mr. Aiden Shaughnessy gave the student council report:

All fall sports registrations have closed and tryouts have been completed. Practices are now expected to begin and students and families are looking forward to another outstanding year of performance of KP athletics. The Marching Band has also begun its season with pre- and post-camp practices at the High School after spending a week at Camp Mataponi in Naples, Maine. The football team also stayed and trained two weeks later at this camp.

KP Cares held their annual Gilly's House Summer Fest yesterday, August 7th, at the Wrentham Developmental Center from 12 to 6 p.m. This family sober event has been a great success in years past, and they were very excited to serve their community. They had events that included face painting and crafts, foods including snow cones, popcorn, cotton candy, and more. KP Cares is in the midst of holding a school supply drive to support KP families who were in need this fall, placing collection bins in the main office and lobby of the High School, which will run up until the 31st.

The Student Council has been planning Freshmen Orientation over the past two months, which will occur on Wednesday, August 30th at the High School in two sessions: from 10 a.m. until noon, and from 1 until 3 p.m. Incoming freshmen and new students will partake in a tour of the school, a scavenger hunt, see a presentation in the Auditorium, and attend a club fair in the Fieldhouse. All students will leave Orientation with an ice cream sandwich or popsicle, as well as a green folder with a brochure of information regarding KP's clubs and organizations, a school map, and booklets courtesy of Healthy KP.

Healthy KP is holding a multi-town vigil for Overdose Awareness Day in honor of the 2,357 Massachusetts residents who lost their lives to overdoses in 2022. This will take place at the Wrentham Town Common at noon and the Norfolk Town Common at 1:00 p.m. -- both of which will occur on Thursday, August 31st.

They will also be holding A Back-To-School social for parents and students, which will occur that same night from 6 to 8 p.m. at the High School and will include their "Hidden In Plain Sight" exhibit and a meet and greet with Principal Bottomley and Superintendent Drolet for parents, and fun activities for students, including various lawn games and social icebreakers.

DECA is hosting its 12th Annual Parent & Member Orientation Night in the High School Auditorium on September 5th at 6:00 p.m. Attendees will gain an overview of the DECA Program and the year to come.

On Friday, September 8th, the varsity football team will play Walpole in their first season game at 7:00 p.m. here on our home turf. There will be a pre-game tailgate and High School administrators will participate in a meet-and-greet from 6 to 7:00 p.m.

That same night after the football game, Healthy KP will be hosting its Fifth Quarter event at the High School which will include an inflatable obstacle course, a dunk tank, a photo booth, music, and other attractions such as crafting, corn hole, spike ball, can jam, hula hooping, and ski ball. Burgers, hotdogs, cotton candy, and snow cones will be available as well.

<u>KP Logo</u>

Dr. Drolet has learned that during the September 2022 school committee meeting, the school committee unanimously voted to use the interlocking Kp logo on all KP district or warrior related branding materials. As a result of this, any and all branded materials purchased from then on by the school district or sports teams should reflect that school committee vote. Dr. Drolet communicated this to the high school principal and athletic director. As of the September 2022 school committee meeting moving forward, there would be no replacing of anything but the old logo would be phased out moving forward.

Public Participation

Dr. Drolet shared that there was a question from the school committee retreat about the public participation policy. There was guidance from legal about one small change based on state law. Dr. Drolet will share with the committee at a future meeting.

Dr. Drolet is available for questions anyone may have. He is very excited to be here and to get started. He acknowledged staff that worked throughout the summer. Custodial staff, counselors, and school secretaries doing registrations and student scheduling.

Dr. Drolet gave an update on the media center at the high school. Due to the continued construction the September 11th meeting will be held again in the library at the middle school. Mr. Zahner and Mr. Azer received an approval with the electrical inspection today. Flooring should be in by the end of the week.

They are working from the top down. Some items are on backorder such as some furniture, doors for the six offices and five classrooms, and retractable doors. Next summer will be the final round of purchasing furniture. The media center should be open to students in another week.

Superintendent's Entry Plan and Next Steps

Dr. Drolet shared his entry plan and next steps. A copy of the entry plan is attached to these minutes and will be posted to the King Philip website. If any committee members have any feedback please let Dr. Drolet know.

History of DESE Grant-Supporting Students' Behavioral, Mental Health and Wellness (taken out of order)

Dr. Drolet followed up with committee members on the DESE Grant which was not funded for this school year. A portion of this grant went towards the DEI Director position which is no longer funded. Dr. Drolet thanked Ms. Dot Pearl and others in the district for that one particular grant. Dr. Drolet handed out the history of the DESE grant each year. For 2023-2024 the grant was not offered for this year. A copy of this is attached to these minutes.

Sports Miscommunication (taken out of order)

Dr. Drolet also gave an update on the miscommunication with sports and the impact on high school sports teams for the playoff divisions for this year and next. Through the Athletic Director, Dr. Drolet was able to get an update on each sport which sport it could have an impact on. This update is attached to these minutes.

The school committee goals should be consistent with Dr. Drolet's goals. This is a chance to review them and talk about them tonight with the committee. Any changes or recommendations can be shared with Dr. Drolet directly.

Mr. Lehan reminded the committee that at the summer retreat, the committee agreed that the superintendent's evaluation form would be redone. The superintendent's evaluation subcommittee will

come up with a best practice evaluation form versus the one that has been used over the years. This will be one of the school committee goals this year.

Mr. Waxman recommended that the subcommittee take a look at the current process, what are the alternatives to the process and build something that works for the school committee and the superintendent. Mr. Cates, Mr. Lehan and Mr. Cronin agreed with this recommendation. The subcommittee includes Ms. Greaney, Mr. Harmon and Mr. Cates. Mr. Waxman will also be on this subcommittee. Ms. Sharpe recommended the committee look at a timeline since there could be new people on the full committee due to elections. Dr. Drolet said an abbreviated evaluation version could be done in March before the school committee elections. This would be a preferred method.
