DECA Trip to California

Students and chaperones attending the Nationals for the DECA overnight trip to Anaheim, California left from Boston on Friday, April 26th, and they will return on Wednesday night, May 1st. This trip was approved in June of 2023, but the TBD's needed to be filled in, so I wanted to share that more detailed information with you. 66 students attended along with 8 chaperones and the cost per student was \$1,550.

Financial Assistance Awarded for King Philip High School Training

We are pleased to announce that King Philip Regional High School has been selected to receive funding from the Massachusetts Attorney General's Office to cover the cost of a local school training as part of the Addressing Hate in School Sports Initiative. The full amount of the award is \$9,000, which will cover the full cost of the two-day training conducted by the Northeastern Center for the Study of Sport in Society. The two-day training can be offered to coaches, teachers, students, or a combination, and the sessions will be administered by professional trainers from Northeastern University.

Duct Taped to Wall for DJ

On April 9th Mr. Glabicky and I were duct taped to the cafeteria wall during the lunch block. Proceeds raised went to supporting our student Davonte Johnson and his family. About \$1,400 was raised this time, which will go towards expenses that insurance doesn't cover, such as helping with gas costs for DJ's family to go back and forth to the hospital, hotels stays nearby, and food near the hospital.
