## Norfolk Temporary Respite Shelter Update

The week of May 5th we had no new students enroll in our school district and one student leave our district. This week of May 12th we had no new students enroll in our school district and no students leave our district. As of now, we have a total of 21 students from the Norfolk Temporary Respite Shelter being educated in our school district (14 high school students and 7 middle school students).

## **DESE's Proposed Amendments to Regional School District Regulation**

On April 30th the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) voted to send proposed amendments to 603 CMR 41.00, the Massachusetts Regional School District regulations, out for public comment. I attended a virtual meeting with DESE staff on May 9th to review their proposed changes. The regulations haven't been updated or changed in about 16 years. The proposed amendments seek to update, streamline, and simplify definitions and procedures related to regional school districts, including establishment of such districts and membership changes in existing districts; clarify the required Commissioner approval and Department review of proposed regional school district agreements (agreements) and proposed amendments to such agreements; and further refine the Commissioner's role in setting of interim budgets when required by law, along with associated Department activities; and add waiver and severability sections to the regulations. The DESE representatives we met with on Friday explained the changes as more of a relaxing of the regulations. The newly proposed regulations do not require us to amend regional agreements, but it should be noted when/if we do amend our regional agreement, we would need to abide by the new regulations. Members of the public can submit comment by June 28, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. via the online survey or to RegionalGovernance@mass.gov, to be presented at the September Board of Elementary and Secondary Education meeting. DESE anticipates returning to the Board for a vote on the final regulations in September 2025.
