- Mr. Lehan opened the Budget Public Hearing at 7:02 PM.
- Presentation/Discussion/Request for Comments

Dr. Drolet reviewed the updates to the FY27 Draft Budget Narrative since the previous meeting (see highlighted revisions). He reported a slight adjustment to the overall financial picture for King Philip, bringing the total proposed budget to \$33,010,184 (page 2). Dr. Drolet also clarified that the third position identified for reduction or elimination in the District is the Licensed Practical Nurse position.

Dr. Drolet pointed out that about \$950,000, or half, of the \$1,909,810 in E&D should be expended next year.

For the FY27 operating budget, Dr. Drolet stated that the administration is now proposing to utilize \$500,000 from Excess and Deficiency (E&D) reserves to support the budget. At the February 9, 2026 School Committee meeting, the original proposal had been to apply \$400,000 from E&D.

Mr. Wehmeyer noted that this revised proposal was not consistent with the direction previously provided by the Committee and expressed concern that the increase in the use of E&D funds had not been requested by the Committee.

Dr. Drolet explained that the revised recommendation resulted from a subsequent meeting with the town managers, during which they requested that additional E&D funds be used to offset the assessment increases. He stated that he believes the District is in a position to increase the E&D appropriation to \$500,000 and recommended adjusting the E&D usage to provide additional assessment relief and improve the likelihood of securing the necessary approval from the towns.

Ms. Brillhante reviewed correspondence from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) from February 12th regarding adjustments to the Chapter 70 foundation enrollment figures for certain districts, King Philip being one of them, following the release of the Governor's budget. She explained that these revisions had minor impacts on the required local contributions for some of the member towns. As a result, the revised total Required Local Contribution is \$21,903,941. The previous total was \$21,924,818.

Mr. Harmon arrived at 7:18 PM

Mr. Lehan then opened the Budget Public Hearing to the public. There were no comments from the public. Mr. Lehan asked for a motion to close the Budget Public Hearing.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Committee members expressed differing views regarding the balance between maintaining funds in reserves and exercising caution about establishing a precedent for future budget decisions, particularly with respect to reducing the Excess and Deficiency (E&D) balance. Ms. Brillhante explained that the E&D Fund (Excess and Deficiency Fund) functions as a "rainy day" reserve, consisting of unexpended funds remaining in the district's accounts at the close of the fiscal year. Committee members also expressed interest in reviewing the current status of special education expenditures and insurance costs.

Mr. Lehan noted that further discussions about the budget will continue to be discussed at the March 9th School Committee meeting. The final vote on the budget is scheduled for March 23rd, requiring a two-thirds majority for approval.

2026-2027 School Calendar (Second Reading)

Dr. Drolet stated that he would return to the Committee at a later date to request a revision to the 2026–2027 school year calendar to include a parent-teacher conference night. He also indicated that, for the current 2025–2026 school year, the use of three snow days would result in the last day of school being Tuesday, June 23, 2026.

Seeing no further comments, Mr. Lehan asked for a motion to approve.

NEW BUSINESS

KPRHS Jazz Ensemble Overnight Field Trip Request May 16, 2026-May 17, 2026 New York, NY/ Weehawken, NJ

Mr. Josh Wolloff provided a brief overview of the KPRHS Jazz Ensemble overnight field trip request scheduled for May 16–17, 2026, to New York City, NY and Weehawken, NJ. He explained that this would be an abbreviated trip, as there would be no competitions or performances but instead, students will get to work with members of the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra for a few hours of clinics. The group also plans to schedule a boat tour around the Statue of Liberty and some sightseeing.

Mr. Cates asked whether the student-to-chaperone ratio was sufficient. Dr. Drolet and Committee members indicated they were comfortable with the proposed 21:2 ratio. Seeing no further comments, a motion was brought forward.

SUPERINTENDENT EVALUATION

Mr. Lehan provided an overview of the Superintendent's performance evaluation. The evaluation focuses on four key areas:

- Instructional Leadership
- Management and Operations
- Family and Community Engagement

- Professional Culture

Seven evaluations were submitted by members of the Committee. Each member rated the Superintendent using the established scale: Unsatisfactory (1), Needs Improvement (2), Proficient (3), or Exemplary (4).

The combined overall rating for the Superintendent for the 2025–2026 school year is 3.425, reflecting a rating between Proficient and Exemplary.

Dr. Drolet thanked the Committee for the feedback provided. Mr. Cronin also shared his comments with the Committee and publicly expressed his appreciation to Dr. Drolet for the work he does. Ms. Sharpe stated that, with regard to the fiscal overhaul that has taken place, it was apparent that the process had not been an easy task. She noted the importance of ensuring that the right personnel, systems, policies, and procedures are in place.

- **A motion was made by Mr. Harmon and seconded by Mr. Cates to approve the Superintendent’s evaluation for the 2025-2026 school year as presented. All in favor: Yes (8) Mr. Lehan, Mr. Cronin, Mr. Cates, Ms. Sharpe, Ms. Lanza, Ms. Lochhead, Mr. Harmon, Ms. Greaney; No (0); Abstain (0); Motion carried 8-0-0.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

FY27 BUDGET DISCUSSION

Mr. Lehan reported that the Finance Subcommittee met and had a discussion regarding the difference between utilizing \$400,000 versus \$500,000 from Excess and Deficiency (E&D) and the potential impact on the member towns. He clarified that Dr. Drolet had been asked to meet with representatives from Plainville and Norfolk, and during that meeting both towns expressed a strong preference to increase the use of E&D from \$400,000 to \$500,000.

Mr. Lehan noted that Dr. Drolet did not propose this change independently. Instead, he contacted Mr. Cates and Mr. Lehan to seek their input, since both of their towns had raised the request. Based on those discussions, it was their recommendation that the administration present the \$500,000 option to the School Committee so the impact on the budget could be reviewed.

Mr. Lehan also asked Ms. Brillhante to prepare a six-year recap of the district’s E&D balance. Based on those figures, even with the use of \$500,000, the district would still retain approximately 3.3% in E&D, which is nearly the highest balance the district has had. He added that after accounting for an anticipated future \$375,000 transfer from E&D designated for schematic design for potential roof replacements at KPMS and KPHS, the district would still maintain over \$1 million in E&D.

Ms. Brillhante reported that the health insurance rate has not yet been finalized; however, she spoke with the district’s brokers, who reassured her that the increase would not exceed the 10% that has been budgeted for FY27. Based on that information, she stated that she feels confident in the FY2027 budget projection, including the proposed use of \$500,000 from Excess and Deficiency (E&D).

Dr. Drolet also reviewed the historical E&D data with the Committee and indicated that he would be recommending the Committee to vote on the proposal to utilize \$500,000 from E&D. Mr. Lehan noted that the final adoption of the FY2027 budget is scheduled for March 23, 2026, at 7:00 PM, and will require a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote for approval. A copy of the historical data is attached to these minutes.

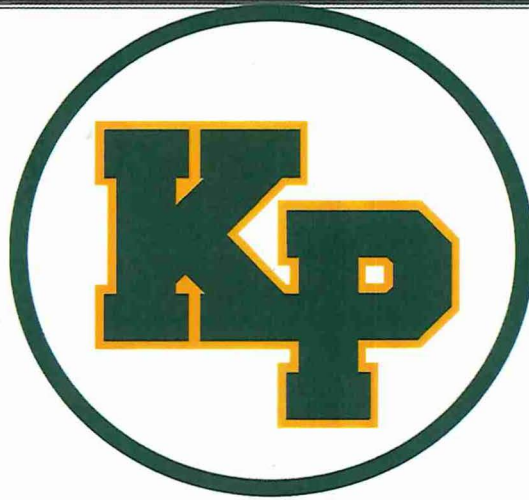
The Coalition for Political Responsibility (CPR) hosted our United States Congressman, Jake Auchincloss, at the High School on Tuesday, March 10th. He and his staff were welcomed by Co-Founders Aiden Shaughnessy and Christopher Stock, Ms. Bottomley, Dr. Drolet, and Ms. Terill. The Congressman met with around 40 students in the Library Flex Rooms with students from all four grades. Students spoke with Rep. Auchincloss on the issues of social media use, the war in Iran, homeownership, the national debt and budget deficit, and access to affordable education and healthcare.

It was an incredible opportunity for students to speak with our elected official representing us on Capitol Hill and to elevate the youth voice on real, youth-facing policy issues. CPR is grateful for the opportunity to have hosted the Congressman and looks forward to their upcoming meetings with Congressman Auchincloss and others on their policy trip to Washington, D.C. this week.

Student Council

Over the course of Tuesday, March 10, Thursday, March 12, and Friday, March 13, Student Council hosted all 346 KPMS eighth graders. The Green Team visited on Tuesday, Yellow Team on Thursday, and Blue Team on Friday. Upon arrival, each team was greeted by up to 30 high school students, cheering and welcoming them. The middle school students had the opportunity to attend a lunch at the high school and received a presentation from Student Council President Aiden Shaughnessy and Student Council Vice President JoHanna Ragan regarding the clubs and organizations available at the high school, how to get involved, where to find information, and high school sports information. The School Counselors presented graduation requirements, credit information, course selection information, and schedule information. The middle school students were divided into three different groups where they were assigned up to 9 high school students that brought them on a 20 minute tour of the high school, participated in a 20 Q&A panel with Ms. Poirier, and completed their course selection for the upcoming school year. The days were concluded with a final time for questions and trivia from the School Counselors before heading back to the middle school.

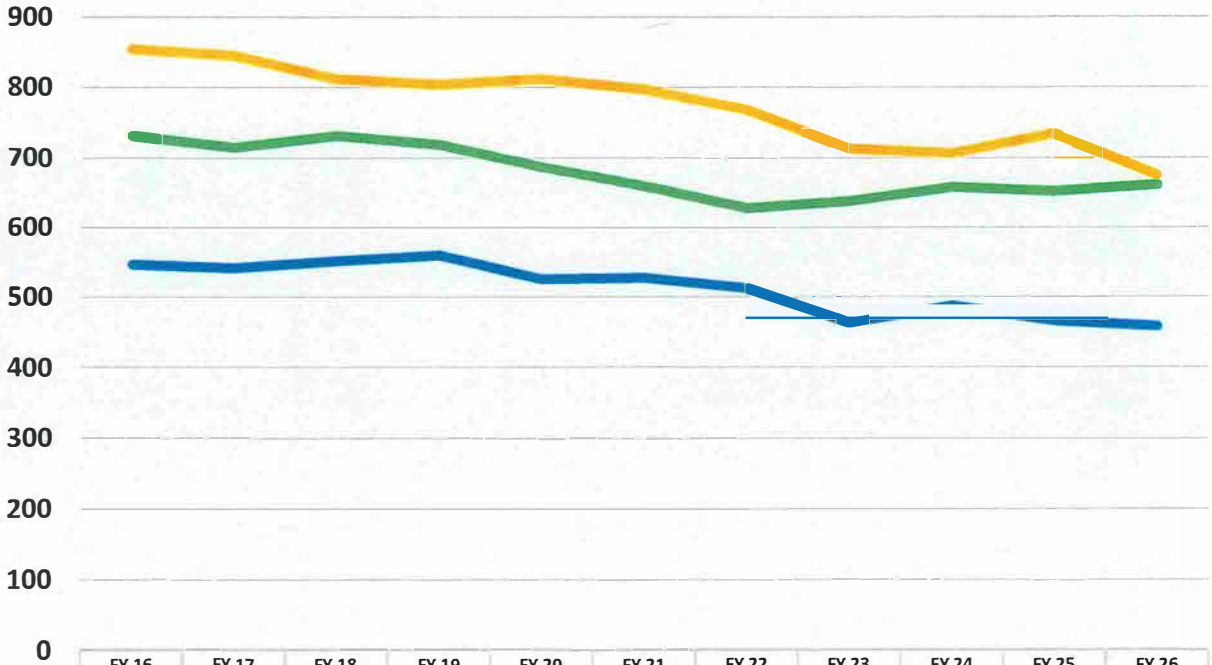

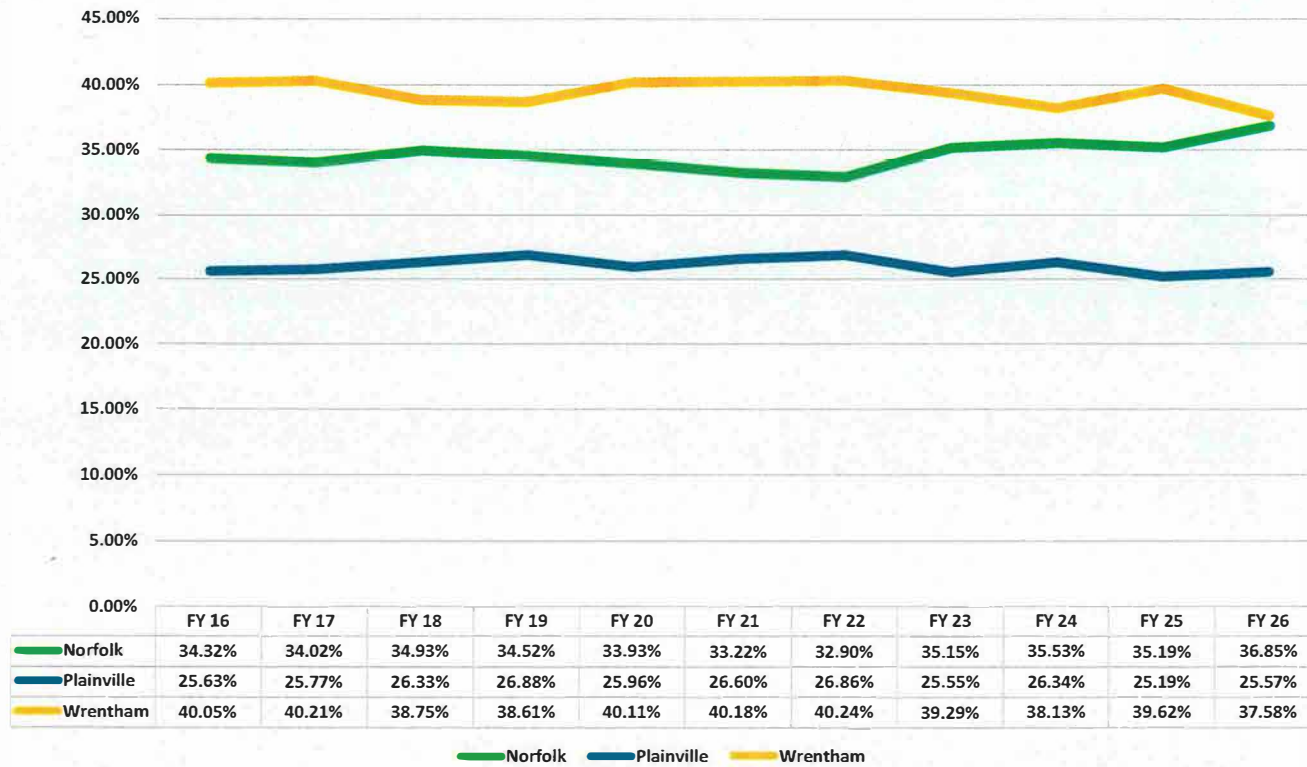

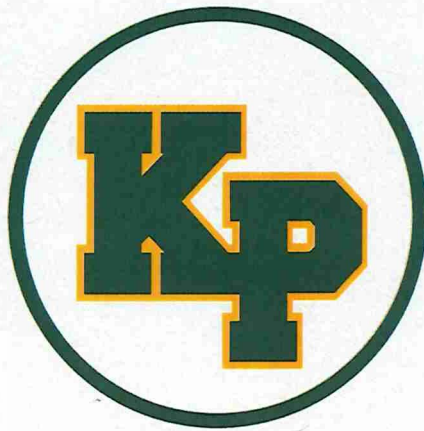
