Class of 2029



We'd like to make a donation to the King Philip basketball program. We've got a lightly-used The Gun 10k by Shootaway shooting machine.

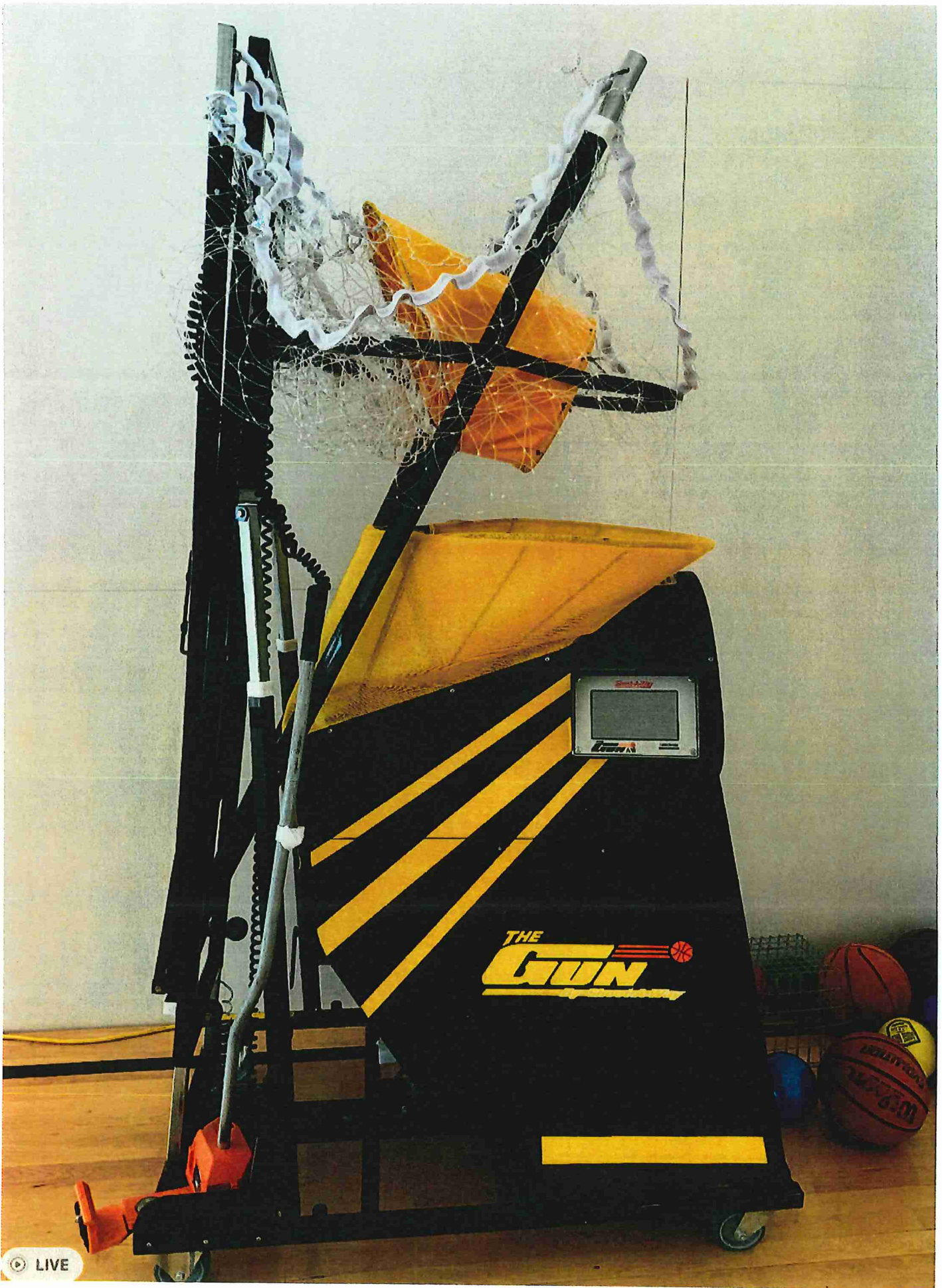
Thanks to this device, my sons have become excellent marksmen, as evidenced by their performance at the KP alumni games.

To meet this appropriation, the District is authorized to appropriate said amounts from available funds from our Excess and Deficiency (E&D) under the District Agreement, as amended, or pursuant to any other enabling authority. The District acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need as determined by the MSBA, and any Project costs the District incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the District."

Hi Andy,

Not sure if you need to run this through someone else at the firm, but we are moving forward with an MSBA Accelerated Repair Program project at both schools for roof replacement. Below is the language they suggested and approved for us to have our School Committee vote on to use E&D funds to pay for schematic design this spring (then in the spring of '27 we would go to the towns to ask for funding with real costs). Please approve or provide any feedback for any changes needed on the wording below according to our by-laws (more relevant) and regional agreement (perhaps less relevant). Both documents are attached. Jill is also copied, as I would ask her to also have this looked over by any bond counsel we may have (although this is to use E&D funds - we would not go out to bond for another year if it moved forward). This is somewhat time sensitive. Thanks and feel free to call me with any questions. -Rich
